Preservation Virginia: Our mission is to make Virginia's communities and historic places of memory stronger, more vital and economically sustainable through preservation, education and advocacy. Preservation Virginia has helped save more than 400 historic places by empowering communities and embracing the places of our past as vital to present and future generations. Our three areas of focus include preservation, education and advocacy.

Preservation: Our preservation initiatives include owning and maintaining 9 historic properties. Through our ongoing partnerships, we are able to extend our efforts to protect and preserve historic places and communities in all regions of Virginia.

Education: Groups and individuals across the state depend on us as a resource for relevant and timely information and guidance. Through the generosity of our supporters, we teach, share and collaborate for the preservation and enhancement of Virginia's communities through our various educational programs.

Advocacy: Preserving history requires responsible solutions and an engaged public that recognizes the value of our historic resources. As an advocate for Virginia's historic resources, we work closely with decision-makers to communicate the economic and cultural benefits of preservation. We also encourage the continuation, strengthening and introduction of important preservation-related policies and programs.

Preservation Virginia seeks a Junior Preservation Craftsperson who will work as part of Preservation Virginia's architecture team to continue to maintain our nine historic sites across the Commonwealth. The list of Preservation Virginia properties range in location from Hanover County (Scotchtown) to the City of Virginia Beach (Cape Henry Lighthouse) and span 1607 (Jamestowne) to 1835 (Tucker Brothers' Store). In addition, the architecture staff works on select contractual projects for historically significant structures throughout the state, known as fee-for-service projects. This position reports to the Senior Craftsperson. All projects are designated and overseen by the Preservation Specialist/Project Manager.

The successful candidate will support the mission and vision of Preservation Virginia and be willing and able to document projects via preservation reports, write blogs and articles and speak on camera and to the public about their work. They will be able to be based within driving distance to Jamestowne and Bacon's Castle, where Preservation Virginia's workshops are located. Basic skills in masonry and/or carpentry and working knowledge of traditional building materials and construction. Experience with preservation specific repair techniques and architectural documentation are preferred. This position provides on-the-job training and experience preserving 17th, 18th and 19th century Virginia architecture and an applicant with an appetite to increase their skill levels is a must.

Minimum Qualifications:

- High School Diploma or equivalent.
- Familiarity with traditional building materials and methods.
- Ability to Lift, carry, push, and pull object(s) weighing up to 75 pounds
- Valid Driver's License; ability to provide your own personal transportation and capability to operate company vehicles and trailers
- Ability to travel and work throughout the state of Virginia with occasional overnight stays
- Prior carpentry and/or masonry work experience or equivalent training.
- Work in outdoor environments year round and safely work from ladders and scaffolding.
- Effectively and safely operate a variety of trade tools and equipment.
- Basic computer, email, and digital camera skills.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience in other trades including painting, roofing, metalwork, plastering, HVAC, plumbing, or electrical work
- Academic training in historic preservation or related fields
- Knowledge and experience repairing and preserving historical architectural fabric consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Historic Preservation.
- Ability to read architectural drawings, schematics, shop drawings, and blueprints
- Familiarity with the architectural history of Virginia
- Ability to generate architectural documentation and project reports
- Experience in other trades including painting, roofing, metalwork, plastering, HVAC, plumbing, and electrical work
- Ability to identify different periods of construction through analysis of tool marks, material use and construction techniques.
