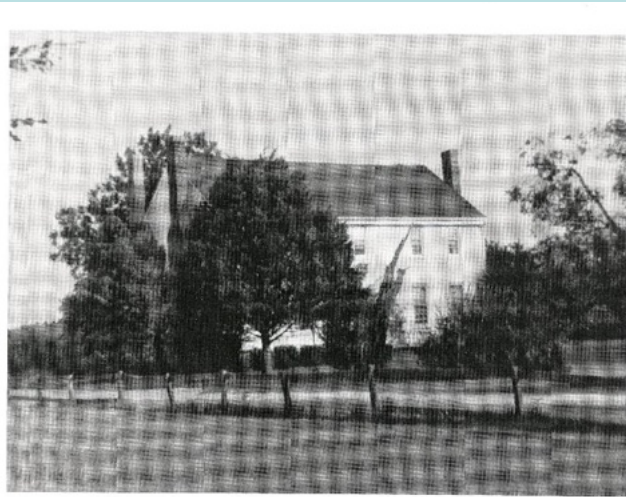

BELLMONT

BELLMONT, built in 1734, is a typical frame farmhouse of the period, a story and a half with dormer windows, big outside chimneys and a basement. The floors are of heart pine and the chair rails in the front rooms are of one wide board. The steep little stairway has a Chinese Chippendale style railing.

The Nat Turner slave insurrection was stopped at Belmont. Dr. Simon Blount, a descendant of Samuel Blount who built the house, was living here in 1831. He called his slaves together and asked them to choose whether they would join Nat Turner or help him defend Belmont. They decided to stay, and Belmont became a refuge for terrified residents of Southampton County.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Marks, present owners of Belmont, have made no changes in the house except to add a screened front porch across the front.

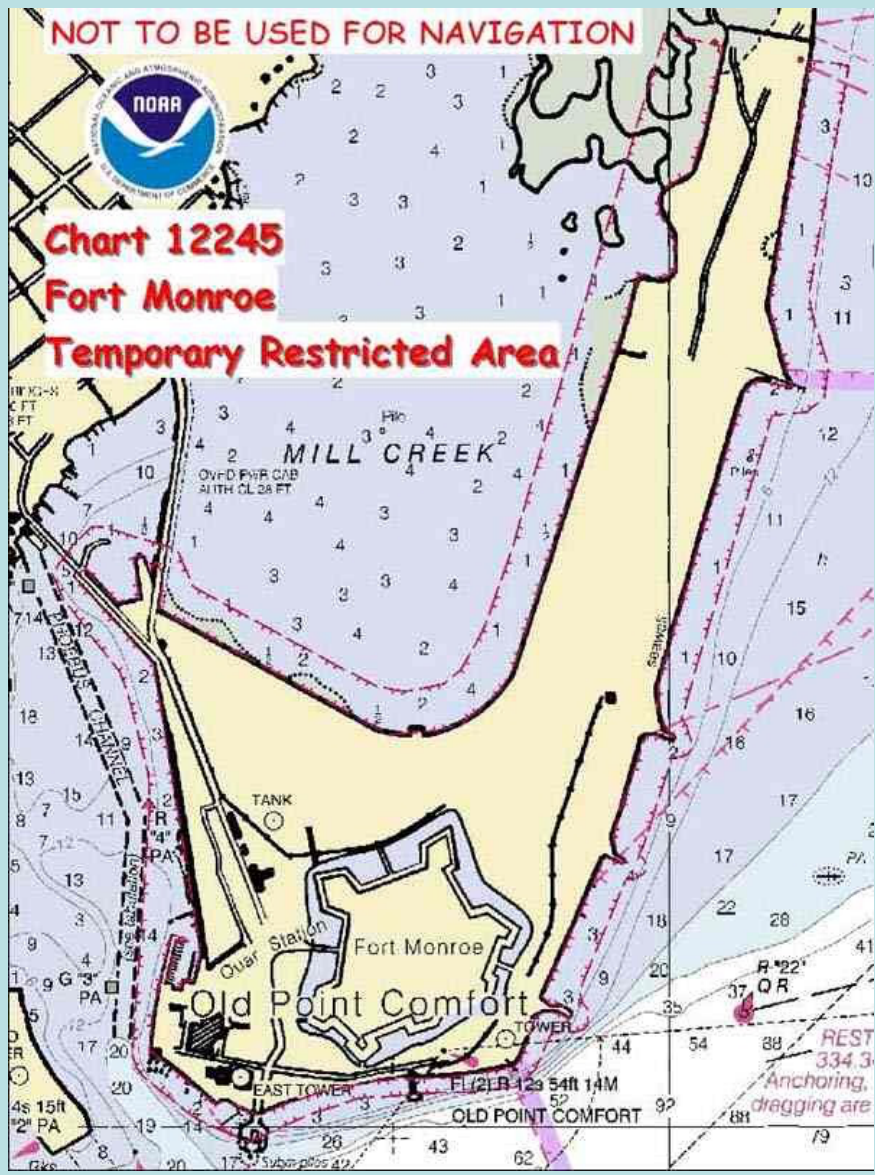

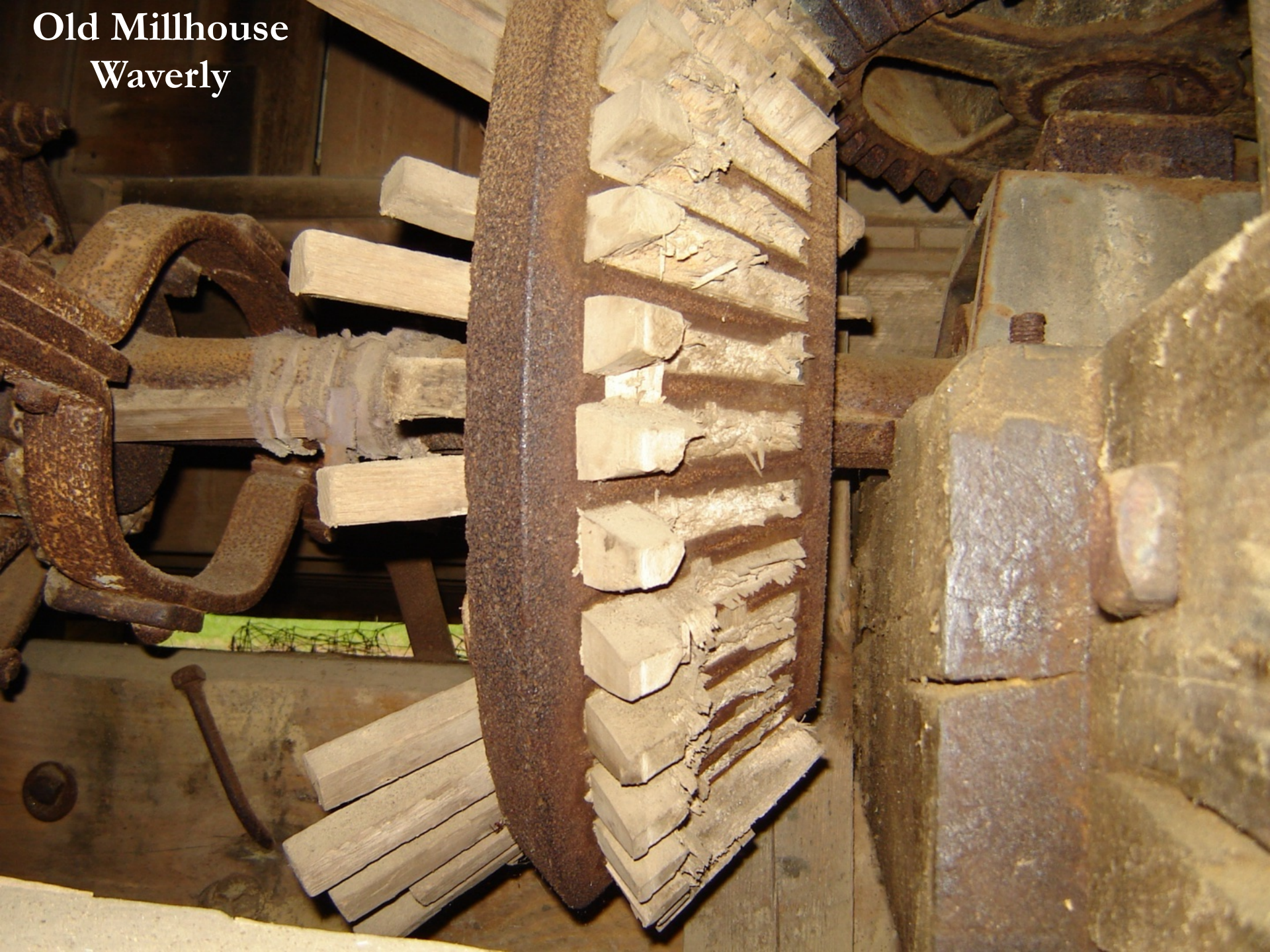
